

What is the most expensive city in the world? According to a study on the cost of living in the world, Singapore, followed by Paris, Oslo, Zurich, and Sydney, gets to keep the name it earned the year before. It's no surprise with the city's high prices for clothes, and cars. The next five on the top ten list are Melbourne, Geneva, Copenhagen, Hong Kong and Seoul. Basically, the top five cities are the same as last year.

In 11th place is London. The UK city is now as expensive as the world's most expensive city two years ago, Tokyo. If you are wondering about New York City, even though it is in 22nd place, it is still the most expensive city in the US. Interestingly, both Sydney and Melbourne were cheaper than New York City ten years ago. However, thanks to Australia's stronger dollar and higher and higher cost of living, the two cities have moved up.
